Ambassador Reynoso: “Black Americans have left an indelible mark” on the US

National Black History Month

On this Wednesday, the US Ambassador in Spain, Julissa Reynoso, remarked the importance of the black people in the history of the United States.

Yet as we celebrate Black History Month, we recognize the persistent discrimination and challenges faced by Black communities in the United States and around the world, throughout history and continuing today,” explained Ambassador Julissa Reynoso.

And concluded: “As such, today I am proud to display a banner affirming that Black Lives Matter. As Amanda Gorman said in 'The Hill We Climb,' her poem for President Biden’s inauguration just over a year ago, “being American is more than a pride we inherit. It’s the past we step into and how we repair it.”

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
